The unit can be conveniently controlled from anywhere via the Stadler Form app, allowing you to adjust the temperature and settings on the go. At the same time, Emil impresses with his aesthetic, elegant design. With the included window sealing kit, the unit is ready for use in no time.

Emil ensures a thoroughly pleasant atmosphere in summer with these features:

1) Cooling tailored to your personal comfort

With Emil, you can easily adjust the room temperature to suit your needs. The built-in thermostat can be set precisely to the desired temperature. Once the set temperature is reached, the unit switches off automatically to avoid unnecessary energy consumption. With a cooling capacity of 9,000 BTU/h, Emil is ideal for rooms up to 35 m² and, combined with his energy efficiency class A, offers fast yet efficient cooling for hot days.



2) 3-in-1 device for versatile use

Emil offers three functions in one: in cooling mode, he maintains the desired temperature; in dehumidification mode, he reduces humidity; and in fan mode, he ensures refreshing air circulation. The unit also comes with everything you need to get started straight away: a window sealing kit, an exhaust and drain hose, and a remote control.

3) Easy installation combined with convenient control

Emil is ready to use in no time: installation is quick and easy using the supplied window sealing kit – with no drilling or screws required – making him suitable for rented properties too. Once the air conditioner is set up, he can be controlled flexibly: directly on the unit, via remote control or via Wi-Fi using the Stadler Form app. This means you can adjust the desired temperature on the go and monitor the room temperature at any time.



4) Carefully designed down to the last detail for everyday use

Emil impresses not only with his performance, but also with his suitability for everyday use. With his slim, compact design, Emil fits even into smaller rooms and complements any interior design scheme as a stylish accessory. The dimmable LEDs provide added convenience: the display switches off and

the LEDs on the control panel are dimmed – ideal for bed- or children’s rooms. His integrated castors allow Emil to remain versatile and to be moved effortlessly from room to room.

Good to know: The difference between air conditioners and fans lies in how they work: whilst a fan circulates the air in the room and provides cooling through the airflow, an air conditioner actively lowers the temperature. It draws in the warm air from the room, cools it inside the unit via a heat exchanger, and then releases it back into the room as cool air. The resulting warm exhaust air is channelled outside via the supplied hose. Air conditioning units therefore offer an effective solution for a pleasantly temperate indoor climate, particularly on hot summer days.
